

Magick receives \$20,000 preemptive settlement from Warren Tire, Kellogg Brothers cleared of Russian connection inquiry- New Deck of Cards start funding for philanthropic foundation

Bob and Wayne Kellogg have been cleared after a New York State probe into questions about their connection to groups trying to stall humanitarian aid to war-torn places. The two owners of Warren Tire have given Matthew "Magick" Szal a \$20,000 preemptive settlement to avoid a battle in civil court. With the aforementioned funds, Magick hopes to grow his business, Magick Mechanic and then his foundation.

It was clear a return to Warren Tire was on the table, yet with Magick Mechanic officially forming as an LLC last month; things are busy. Matt is also designing a deck of cards, which will be sold on his website to help fund his foundation for war orphans. The time associated with

developing the deck and it as a creative project are the main reasons he can no longer return to work as a mechanic for Warren Tire. He has been a full-time mechanic with the company in Latham and then Schenectady for six-months.

These six months have allowed Matt to save enough money to purchase some cheap project cars that no longer run and attempt to fix them. After they are fixed, they can be sold for several thousand dollars in profit. This is another business that Magick Mechanic does besides the mobile work with customers. Matt is moving back to Texas, and his company will be his sole focus. He will also try to find corporate sponsors for the foundation and market the "American Game" deck to raise
