Judge Brandt kills foundation for orphans - Magick scrambles to find an alternate fundraising source to still save kids from refugee camps

Matthew "Magick" Szal will sell a designer deck of cards to raise charitable funds for his foundation after losing the ability to sue Timothy Szal. Magick lost the ability to sue further after a hearing on October 30th, in which the contract for the renovation work done at 1342 Meadow Glen was not recognized by the court in JP03-24-SC000027470.

The case Matthew Szal V. Timothy Szal has been terminated with no property returned, unpaid funds or any compensation for damaged property to the plaintiff. Magick had his motion for discovery denied as well, hoping some phone or bank records would be able to clear things up.

Judge Brandt does not seem to care about contracts or emails. His abrupt dismissal of the case and granting Timothy special privileges leave an appeal as the only option. A large amount of money creates the possibility of corruption, and foul play always lurks around every corner in these

situations. Yet, the machinery of Law Enforcement was abused in such a way that its residual effects a year later can still be felt with Judge Brandt's disposition.

Vanessa Arevalo is still missing. Her mother, Maria Arevalo, is distraught that this possible lead has not been looked into and said, " I am so upset the poor little orphans can not go to their boarding schools because the money for the foundation in her honor has been legally stolen."

The deck of designer cards will be available for sale on Thanksgiving, and pre-sale orders will be made available on mattszal.com in the next week or two. For every deck of cards bought, 50% will go towards creating a foundation that sends war orphans to boarding schools from the conflicts in Eastern Europe and the Middle East in honor of Szalovera's founding partner, Vanessa.
